




SEPTEMBER 2021 INCIDENT DATA - HIGH PROFILE INCIDENTS DURING JEWISH HIGH HOLIDAYS

As Jews around the world celebrated the Jewish High Holiday season during September, high profile incidents of antisemitism persisted, targeting Jewish communities and individuals with physical attacks, vandalism, and hate speech. CAM tracked a slight 3.8% increase in Islamist antisemitic activity in September compared to August 2021, amidst a drop in incidents from other ideological sources. Overall, CAM monitored a total of 163 antisemitic incidents reported in the media in September. a 4.1% decrease from August's total.

Increasing Frequency of Physical Attacks

GLOBAL ANTISEMITISM FOCAL POINTS

During September, CAM monitored an increasing frequency of physical attacks against Jewish individuals. In total, 15 acts of violence were recorded including particularly distressful ones in Los Angeles, US: Hamburg and Hagen, Germany: Toronto, Canada: Pisa, Italy; Lyon, France; London, UK, and elsewhere.



Disturbing Spate of Vandalism

September also saw a disturbing spate of antisemitic vandalism, many of which targeted synagogues and Jewish institutions during the holiday period. CAM monitored 55 incidents of antisemitic vandalism in September. Jewish sites were targeted in Minnesota, Illinois, New Mexico, Massachusetts, New York, Argentina, Greece, Australia, Ukraine, Germany, and many other places - underscoring the breadth of surging antisemitism worldwide.

Record-High 38 Countries Shun Durban IV Conference

38 nations did not participate in the UN's Durban IV meeting in New York on September 22nd, more than double the number of countries that opted out of the Durban III gathering in 2011. Most withdrawing countries cited concerns about the poisonous legacy of the original Durban "World Conference Against Racism," held 20 years ago in South Africa, which infamously turned into an antisemitic hatefest that marked a disturbing turning point in the mainstreaming of the delegitimization of Israel under the guise of human rights advocacy.
