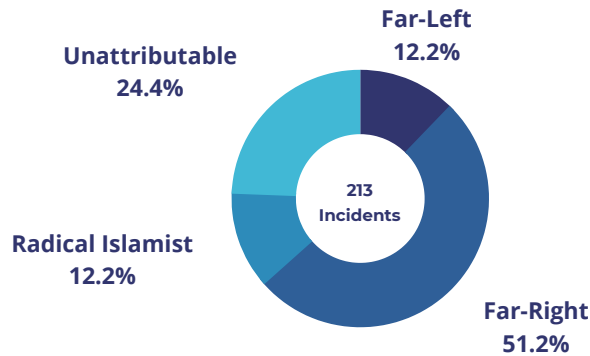

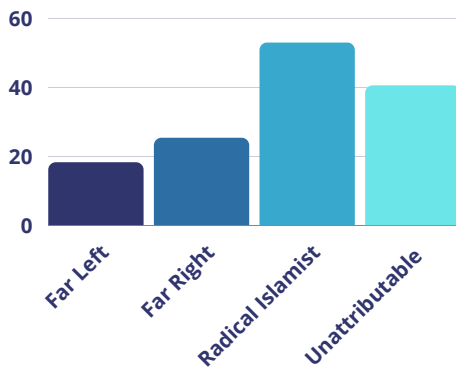

NOVEMBER 2021 INCIDENT DATA - ACROSS-THE-BOARD RISES IN ANTISEMITIC ACTIVITIES

During a month that ended with Jews celebrating the Hanukkah story of victory over oppression, the CAM Information Hub tracked across-the-board rises in far-right, far-left, and Islamist antisemitism, highlighting the contemporary threats still facing the Jewish people today.

Overall, CAM monitored a total of **213 antisemitic incidents reported in the media in November** - including 75 incidents (35.2%) of vandalism and 20 (9.4%) physical threats, representing a **30.7% overall increase from October** and the highest number recorded since a surge of incidents in May 2021. Through November, CAM has monitored 2021 media reports of antisemitic incidents worldwide so far this year.

GLOBAL ANTISEMITISM FOCAL POINTS



Antisemitism Spikes Worldwide During Hanukkah, Driven by Public Menorah Desecrations

The eight day Jewish holiday of Hanukkah was accompanied by a spike of antisemitic incidents. The high visibility of the "Festival of Lights," with menorahs on display in prominent open locations and the windows of private homes, provides an easily-accessible, target-rich environment. The CAM Information Hub monitored 17 reports of antisemitic incidents specifically tied to public menorah displays or other Hanukkah celebrations.



Series of High-Profile Antisemitic Incidents Sweep Across Southwestern United States

Recent weeks saw a troubling string of antisemitic incidents across the southwestern United States, largely in Texas and Arizona. The epicenter of this antisemitic outburst was in Austin, culminating with an arson at a Reform synagogue, for which an 18-year-old Neo-Nazi suspect was arrested on November 10th.



Vienna Forum Focuses on Fight Against Antisemitism in Sports

In 2021, the CAM Information Hub has tracked more than 52 media reports of sports-related antisemitic incidents worldwide, 36 of which were tied to soccer. A majority of the incidents had far-right connotations. On November 11th, the "Global Conference on Football's Role in Combating Antisemitism" was co-hosted in Vienna, Austria, by the Chelsea FC Foundation, Jewish Community of Vienna, Office of the UK's Independent Antisemitism Adviser Lord John Mann, and the International Coalition for Combating Antisemitism.
