




JANUARY 2022 INCIDENT DATA - TEXAS SYNAGOGUE HOSTAGE-TAKING HIGHLIGHTS GROWING THREATS

Antisemitism was quickly in the headlines to start 2022, with the Jan. 15th hostage-taking incident at Congregation Beth Israel in Colleyville, Texas, which thankfully ended with all the hostages safely freed.

In total, the CAM Information Hub tracked **158 antisemitic incidents reported in the media in January**, a 9.2% decrease from January 2021's 174 incidents. However, January 2022 experienced a 14.1% increase in incidents of far-right antisemitism compared to calendar year 2021, while decreases of 5.2%, 5.8%, and 3.1% were seen in the far-left, Islamist, and unattributable categories. CAM monitored 19 physical attacks targeting Jews, a 90% rise for the month of January year-over-year. 45 incidents of antisemitic vandalism were recorded, an 8.2% decrease year-over-year.

Increasing Threats to Synagogues and Jewish Centers Predated Texas Attack, Combat Antisemitism Movement Data Shows

The hostage-taking incident at Congregation Beth Israel in Colleyville, Texas, on Jan. 15 drew renewed attention to the rising threats faced by Jewish institutions worldwide, particularly in the United States. In the three months preceding the attack, the CAM Information Hub tracked 34 media reports of incidents globally in which synagogues and Jewish centers were targeted, including 22 in the U.S. alone (65% of total).



Amnesty International Singles Out Israel With 'Apartheid' Libel

An Amnesty International [report](#) declaring Israel an "apartheid" state distorted history, held the Jewish state to double standards not applied to any other nation in the world, ignored the crimes of Palestinian terrorist organizations against Israeli civilians, and portrayed Israel's mere existence as the sole obstacle to Middle East peace.



Study Finds 2021 Was 'Most Antisemitic Year in the Last Decade'

A World Zionist Organization and Jewish Agency [report](#) released ahead of International Holocaust Remembrance Day revealed there was an average of more than 10 antisemitic incidents per day across the globe in 2021, with many more going unreported. Nearly 50% of the incidents took place in Europe, and around 30% took place in the United States.
