


MAY 2022 INCIDENTS DATA - SLIGHT YEAR-TO-DATE DROP FROM 2021

The CAM Information Hub tracked **153 antisemitic incidents reported in the media worldwide in May 2022**, marking a daily average of 4.9 incidents. Year-to-date, CAM has recorded a total of 876 incidents, or an average of 5.8 incidents per day.

May 2022 saw 69 incidents of far-right antisemitism (45.1% of total), as well as 31 (20.3%), 23 (15.0%), and 30 (19.6%) in the Islamist, far-left, and unidentifiable categories, respectively.

CAM also monitored 21 physical threats against Jews in May, as well as 63 incidents of antisemitic vandalism.

UN Special Rapporteur Publishes Eight-Point Action Plan Against Antisemitism

"Antisemitism remains a persistent and serious global problem, with a range, scale and depth that has continued to expand since 2019," United Nations Special Rapporteur on Freedom of Religion or Belief Dr. Ahmed Shaheed writes.

The new plan is a follow-up to the historic 2019 report authored by Shaheed that urged countries to "adopt a human-rights based approach in combating antisemitism."



Prosecutor Suspects Antisemitic Motive in Murder of French Jewish Man in Lyon

A French prosecutor said 89-year-old Jewish man René Hadjaj, who was pushed out of his 17th-story apartment window in Lyon by a neighbor, may have been killed because he was Jewish.

The assessment is based on past antisemitic social media posts published by the suspect, Rachid Kheniche.

The case is disturbingly reminiscent of the murder of 65-year-old French Jewish woman Sarah Halimi at her Paris home in April 2017.



CAM to Host Mayors Panel on Fighting Antisemitism at Buenos Aires Summit

The Latin American Forum for Combating Antisemitism – co-hosted by the Latin American Jewish Congress (CJL) and Israel's Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Israel, in partnership with CAM, the Latino Coalition for Israel (LCI), and Hatzad Hasheni – will be held on July 17th-18th, in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

The event coincides with the 28th anniversary of the AMIA Jewish community center bombing in the Argentine capital.
