


JULY 2022 INCIDENTS DATA - 3.4% YEAR-TO-DATE DECREASE FROM 2021

The CAM Information Hub tracked 160 antisemitic incidents reported in the media worldwide in July 2022, marking a daily average of 5.2 incidents. Year-to-date, CAM has recorded a total of 1,186 incidents, or an average of 5.6 incidents per day, down 3.4% from the same time frame in 2021.

July 2022 saw 99 incidents of far-right antisemitism (61.9% of total), as well as 16 (11.3%), 11 (6.9%), and 32 (20.0%) in the Islamist, far-left, and unidentifiable categories, respectively.

CAM also monitored 11 physical threats against Jews in July, as well as 85 incidents of antisemitic vandalism.

Antisemitic 'Jewish Lobby' Comments by UN Official Draw **Global Condemnation**

Miloon Kothari – a member of the UN's "Independent International Commission of Inquiry on the Occupied Palestinian Territory, including East Jerusalem, and in Israel" – said in an interview, "We are very disheartened by the social media, whether controlled by the Jewish lobby, or specific NGOs, a lot of money is being thrown to try and discredit us."

Kothari also guestioned why Israel was "even a member" of the UN," accusing it of attempting to "undermine UN mechanisms."



US Department of Education Opens Probe of Antisemitism Allegations at USC

The U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights has officially launched an investigation into allegations that administrators at the University of Southern California did not adequately address claims of antisemitism targeting a Jewish student leader, who resigned from her role as Undergraduate Student Government (USG) vice president in 2020 after she faced a campaign of targeted harassment by anti-Israel activists over her religious identity and Zionist beliefs.



Latin American Forum for Combating Antisemitism Convenes in Argentina

The distinguished gathering in Buenos Aires brought together top government officials, antisemitism experts, and Jewish community leaders to discuss contemporary manifestations of Jewhatred in the Latin America region and effective measures to counter the phenomenon.
