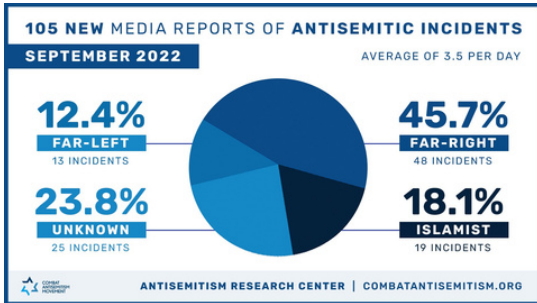
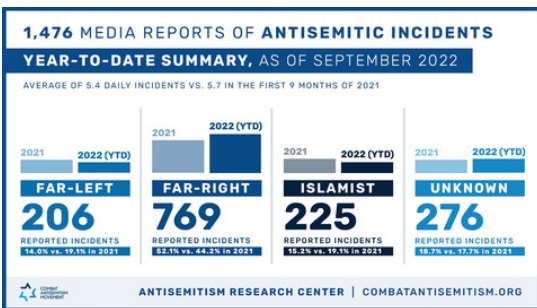

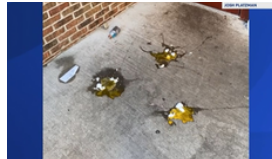
### SEPTEMBER 2022 INCIDENTS DATA - 5.4% YEAR-TO-DATE DECREASE FROM 2021

The CAM Information Hub tracked **105 antisemitic incidents reported in the media worldwide in September 2022**, marking a daily average of 3.5 incidents. Year-to-date, CAM has recorded a total of 1,476 incidents, or an average of 5.4 incidents per day, down 5.4% from the same time frame in 2021.

September 2022 saw 48 incidents of far-right antisemitism (45.7% of total), as well as 19 (18.1%), 13 (12.4%), and 25 (23.8%) in the Islamist, far-left, and unidentifiable categories, respectively.

CAM also monitored nine physical threats against Jews in September, as well as 49 incidents of antisemitic vandalism.

#### U.S. College Towns Hit by String of Antisemitic Incidents During Rosh Hashanah Holiday

As Jewish communities worldwide celebrated Rosh Hashanah (the Jewish New Year), antisemitic flyers were distributed near the University of Michigan campus in Ann Arbor by the neo-Nazi Goyim Defense League.

Meanwhile, in New Brunswick, New Jersey, the house of a Jewish fraternity, Alpha Epsilon Pi (AEPi), was vandalized.

In response, New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy tweeted, "Antisemitism has no place in New Jersey."



#### Central American Leaders Vow to Combat Antisemitism at Historic Event in Panama

At the second annual Central America-Israel Forum, held this year at Parlatino, the Latin American Parliament, in Panama City, Panama, more than 300 participants from 14 countries discussed contemporary relations between Central America, Israel, and the United States, and addressed challenges and opportunities in the global fight against Jew-hatred.

Next year's summit will be held in Montevideo, Uruguay.

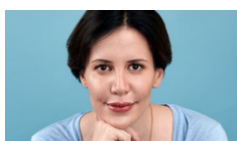


#### Online Webinar Teaches Students How to Tackle Threat of Rising Antisemitism in Campus Media
