


DECEMBER 2022 MEDIA REPORTS OF ANTISEMITIC INCIDENTS




DECEMBER 2022 INCIDENTS DATA - 13.3% YEAR-TO-DATE DECREASE FROM 2021

The CAM Antisemitism Research Center tracked **120 antisemitic incidents reported in the media worldwide in December 2022**, marking a daily average of 3.9 incidents. In all of 2022, CAM recorded a total of 1,921 incidents, or an average of 5.3 incidents per day, down 13.3% from 2021.

December 2022 saw 58 incidents of far-right antisemitism (48.3% of total), as well as 13 (10.8%), 12 (10.0%), and 37 (30.8%) in the far-left, Islamist, and unidentifiable categories, respectively.

CAM also monitored 17 physical threats against Jews in December, as well as 54 incidents of antisemitic vandalism.

New Municipal Action Plan Against Antisemitism Unveiled at Global Mayors Summit in Greece

The six-point plan details what city leaders can do to fight religious bigotry nurture Jewish life in their cities, including: appointing antisemitism coordinators; adopting the IHRA Working Definition of Antisemitism; allocating municipal resources for interfaith initiatives; enforcing a zero-tolerance antisemitism policies; educating municipal staff and law enforcement about antisemitism; and celebrating Jewish heritage and culture.



White House Establishes Inter-Agency Group to Fight Rising Jew-Hatred in U.S.

The Biden administration set up a task force to develop a national strategy to "raise understanding about antisemitism and the threat it poses to the Jewish community and all Americans, address antisemitic harassment and abuse both online and offline, seek to prevent antisemitic attacks and incidents, and encourage whole-of-society efforts to counter antisemitism and build a more inclusive nation," the White House said.



German Cabinet Approves First National Plan to Combat Antisemitism and Foster Jewish Life

The 52-page strategy includes five realms of action -- "data collection, research and accurate assessment of antisemitism; education as prevention; new approaches to Holocaust remembrance; increasing security; and making current and past Jewish life in Germany visible."

Fighting antisemitism is a task for the "whole of society," German Federal Antisemitism Commissioner Dr. Felix Klein said.
