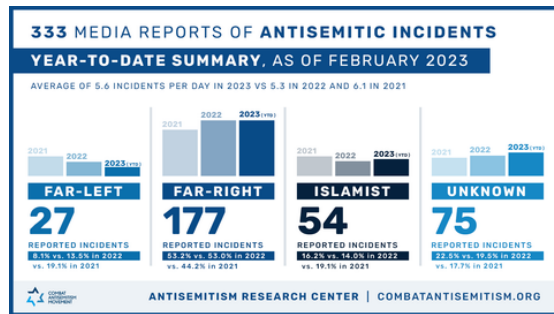
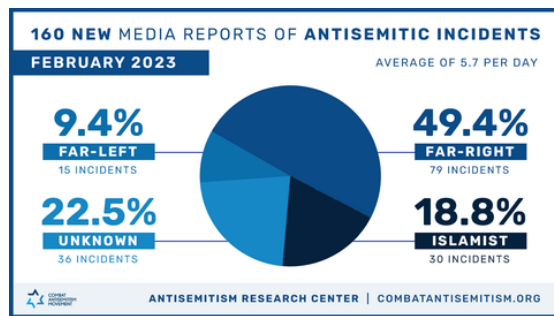


FEBRUARY 2023 INCIDENTS DATA 12.5% OF INCIDENTS INVOLVED PHYSICAL THREATS

The CAM Antisemitism Research Center tracked **160 antisemitic incidents reported in the media worldwide in February 2023**, marking a daily average of 5.7 incidents. In all of 2022, CAM recorded a total of 1,921 incidents, or an average of 5.3 incidents per day.

February 2023 saw 79 incidents of far-right antisemitism (49.4% of total), as well as 15 (9.4%), 30 (18.8%), and 36 (22.5%) in the far-left, Islamist, and unidentifiable categories, respectively.

CAM also monitored 20 physical threats against Jews in February 2023, as well as 53 incidents of antisemitic vandalism.

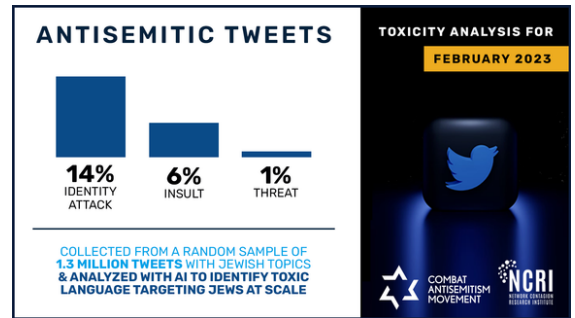

TWITTER TOXICITY ANALYSIS

February's monthly Toxicity Analysis – published by CAM in partnership with the Network Contagion Research Institute (NCRI) – showed that toxicity scores for tweets mentioning Jews remained at similar levels to January.

The results – based on a statistically-significant random sample of 100,000 tweets out of 1.3 million indexed using a machine learning model – revealed 14% of the tweets were identity attacks on Jews, 6% were insults to Jews, and 1% were threats against Jews.

One tweet was identified as a credible targeted physical threat to the U.S. Jewish community and this information was relayed to law enforcement authorities.

Threats to American Synagogues Soar in First Two Months of 2023

From the spray-painting of Nazi symbols on synagogues and to violent assaults on Jews going about their daily lives, the contemporary landscape on antisemitism both in America and worldwide is one of increasing menace.

In the first two months of 2023, the CAM Antisemitism Research Center monitored 33 media-reported antisemitic incidents in which Jewish institutions were targeted globally -- including 12 houses of worship in the United States.



Senior Archbishops Call on Christians to Join Together to Fight Antisemitism

Senior archbishops called on Catholics from around the world to gather together to actively help fight the rise of antisemitism at a Feb. 21 event.

The online reception was hosted by CAM to celebrate late Italian "Righteous Among the Nations" Monsignor Giuseppe Placido Nicolini's heroic actions in establishing the "Assisi Network," which provided shelter and safe passage to hundreds of Jewish refugees fleeing the Nazis during the Holocaust.



More Than 15,000 Back Call for Barcelona City Council to Restore Ties With Tel Aviv

The Barcelona City Council approved a resolution on Feb. 24 calling for the "urgent and immediate" restoration the "twin city" agreement with Tel Aviv that was unilaterally severed earlier in the month by Mayor Ada Colau,

Before the vote, CAM, the Israel-Spain Forum Alliance (ISFA), and the Center for Jewish Impact (CJI) had issued a joint letter – backed by a petition with more than 15,000 signatures – urging the council to undo the mayor's action.

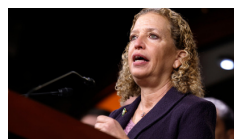
