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Methodology


- Designed and analyzed by Dr. Ira Sheskin, Professor of Geography and Director of the Jewish Demography Project at the University of Miami with the assistance of the Combat Antisemitism movement.
- 4 other Ph.D social scientists reviewed and commented on the survey instrument.
- The field work was conducted by both internet and telephone by the National Opinion Research Center (NORC) at the University of Chicago from August 12 – September 3, 2024.
- The study was fielded using the NORC TrueNorth hybrid calibration process, which utilizes machine learning to statistically combine samples from the AmeriSpeak probability panel (N=515) and an online opt-in panel (N=560).
- Both sample sources fielded the same survey, which screened for Jewish respondents, including both Jews by Religion and Jews of No Religion.
- The overall sample size was 1,075.




Forms of Antisemitism Experienced


Of the respondents who experienced at least 1 of these 7 forms of antisemitism, 72% feel less safe today.











Since October 7, have you, yourself, been the target of an antisemitic remark in person







Since October 7, have you, yourself, been the target of antisemitic vandalism or messaging, such as flyers or pamphlets left on your personal property





Since October 7, have you been the target of an antisemitic attack in person, during which the attacker physically touched you








Did you personally experience antisemitism:

 The 25% who experienced antisemitism in their local community compares to 12% average for 29 Jewish communities in which this question was asked from 2000-2018




Did any of your Jewish children ages 6-17 experience antisemitism:


- Given 1.8 million Jewish children, the 21% implies 380,000 experienced antisemitism since October 7

Social Media




Have you seen or heard any antisemitic content, such as comments or posts online or on social media

Social Media with Antisemitic Remarks Since October 7

- 30% reported the remarks to the platform
- 32% have avoided posting content online that would identify them as Jews or their views of Jewish issues out of fear of antisemitism




Feeling Safe

38% have avoided wearing, carrying, or displaying things that might help people identify them as Jews





Feeling of being safe as a US Jew compared to before October 7


Pew 2020 Feeling of Being Safe as a US Jew Compared to 5 Years Ago (2020 Compared to 2015)



Have you hesitated to participate in Jewish observances or events because you feel less safe than you did before October 7? (among those who feel less safe and who usually participate)




Law Enforcement How effective do you think law enforcement is in responding to the security needs of Jews since October 7



















Jewish Organizations and Synagogue Targets



Have you ever avoided wearing, carrying, or displaying something that would identify you as Jewish in your workplace or around colleagues because of fears of antisemitism











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Explanation of 750,000 College-Related Jewish Adults

- Since we asked about 2 academic years, this number is 25% higher than it would have been otherwise, meaning that in any given academic year, there are about 560,000 college-related Jewish adults
- About 85% of Jews age 25-34 have at least some college
- About 60% of Jews age 25 and over have a college degree
- About 30% of Jews age 25 and over have a graduate degree
- 34% of college students are age 25 and over
- College-related includes faculty, administrators, and staff
- A relatively high percentage of faculty and administrators are Jewish
- The Hillel number of active college students and estimates of Jewish students covers a small fraction of the 4,000 degree-granting colleges and universities in the US
