On October 7, children were among the most vulnerable victims. Of the 1,200 Israelis murdered, 38 were children. 96 children lost one parent, 20 lost both parents, and 42 children were kidnapped to Gaza. In addition, hundreds of children were injured, and thousands were displaced from their homes. The Children of October 7 is dedicated to the children affected most on that tragic day - and now face the task of coping with reality. The documentary features sensitive conversations with children who were released from captivity, children who became orphans, and those who survived the massacre, providing a poignant and heartfelt depiction of their experiences.
