





Antisemitism Up **21.2%** Globally in July 2025 vs. July 2024

#### **GLOBAL ANTISEMITIC INCIDENTS**




In July 2025, the Antisemitism Research Center (ARC) by CAM monitored **554 antisemitic** incidents across the globe, an average of 17.9 incidents per day. Compared with July 2024, the ARC monitored **21.2% more incidents** (457 in July 2024 vs. 554 in July 2025). From January 1 to July 31, 2025, the ARC recorded a total of 3,883 incidents, 9.4% higher than the 3,550 incidents recorded from January 1 to July 31, 2024.


429 of the 554 incidents (77.4%) recorded in July 2025 involved Israel-related antisemitism, reflecting the persistent trend of anti-Zionist rhetoric and attacks directed at Jewish individuals and institutions in the ongoing aftermath of the October 7th massacre.

- Hasidic Jews in New York were attacked by an assailant who spewed anti-Israel hate.
- A group of Israeli teens visiting the Greek island of Rhodes were <u>chased</u> by a mob shouting slurs and threatening them with knives.


There were 61 acts of vandalism in July (11%) targeting Jewish institutions and private properties with swastikas or other antisemitic symbols or threats.


- In Athens, Greece, a kosher restaurant was <u>vandalized</u>, reading 'No Zionist is safe here.'







25 incidents in July (4.5%) involved violence or threats of violence, including physical assaults, bomb threats, and other explicit attempts to intimidate or harm Jewish individuals or communities.

- In Grenoble, France, a rabbi's home was <u>set ablaze</u>.
- Another French rabbi was <u>assaulted</u> near Paris by an assailant who called him a 'dirty Jew.'

143 antisemitic incidents were recorded in the United States in July, representing a 17.2% increase from the 122 incidents recorded in June 2025.

Due in large part to the fact that colleges are currently on summer vacation, the ARC recorded only 9 incidents on U.S. campuses, a number sure to increase dramatically when classes resume for the fall semester.

## **Government Actions**

Governments around the world took meaningful steps in July to counter **rising antisemitism**. Costa Rica adopted the **IHRA Working Definition of Antisemitism**, becoming the 47th country in the world and the sixth in Latin America to do so. In response to growing threats, Virginia passed legislation **banning Nazi symbols**, while the Australian state of Victoria established a **task force** to further empower law enforcement to fight antisemitism following a synagogue arson in Melbourne.
