





Incidents of Holocaust Denial, Distortion, and Trivialization Rise Sharply by 38.5% from July to August

GLOBAL ANTISEMITIC INCIDENTS






458 of the 691 incidents (66.3%) recorded in August 2025 involved Israel-related antisemitism, reflecting the persistent trend of anti-Zionist rhetoric and attacks directed at Jewish individuals and institutions in the ongoing aftermath of the October 7th massacre.


- In the United States, a Utah brewer created a "Dropkick a Zionist" cider.
- In France, a Paris air traffic controller transmitted "Free Palestine" to an El Al plane.
- In Spain, the musician Bob Vylan expressed support for "armed resistance" to oppose "Israel's genocide."

In August 2025, the Antisemitism Research Center (ARC) by CAM monitored **694 antisemitic incidents** across the globe, an average of 22.4 incidents per day. Compared with August 2024, **15.7% more incidents** (600 in August 2024 vs. 694 in August 2025) were monitored. From January 1 to August 31, 2025, a total of 4,574 incidents were recorded, 10.2% higher than the 4,150 incidents recorded from January 1 to August 31, 2024.

AUGUST 2025 ANTISEMITIC INCIDENTS








There were 91 acts of vandalism in August (13.2%) targeting Jewish institutions and private properties with swastikas or other antisemitic symbols or threats.

- In the Netherlands, the Amsterdam World War II memorial was vandalized with the words "Never again is now."
- In the United States, a banner reading "The Weitzman Stands With Israel" at the National American Jewish History Museum was sprayed with red paint.

AUGUST 2025 ANTISEMITIC INCIDENTS






39 incidents in August (5.6%) involved violence or threats of violence, including physical assaults, bomb threats, and other explicit attempts to intimidate or harm Jewish individuals or communities.

- Multiple synagogues in Vermont received letters containing threats to kill worshipers.
- In Poland, an Israeli singer was assaulted with red paint during a performance in Warsaw.

Examples of Holocaust Denial/Distortion/ Trivialization

- In Australia, anti-Israel protesters in Sydney held signs reading "Zionists are neo-Nazis" and "Never again means never again for anyone."
- In Germany, vandals toppled a stone column at a Holocaust memorial in Baden-Baden.
- In France, a Lyon Holocaust memorial was defaced with the words "Free Gaza."
- In the United States, CodePink protested outside the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum.

Antisemitism in the United States


162 antisemitic incidents were recorded in the United States in August, representing a 13.3% increase from the 143 incidents recorded in July 2025.

38 incidents of Holocaust denial, distortion, or trivialization were recorded in August 2025, representing a sharp rise of 35.8% compared with July 2025 (28 incidents in July 2025 vs. 38 incidents in August 2025).



Across the globe, there were 19 acts of antisemitism on college campuses in August targeting Jewish students and institutions.

- In France, it was revealed that a
 Gazan university student studying
 in Paris had previously expressed
 support for Hitler and called to "Kill
 the Jews everywhere." French
 government officials responded by
 revoking her student visa
- In Italy, a professor at the University of Palermo urged his Facebook followers to "unfriend all Jewish 'friends,' even the 'good' ones."





In the United States, there were 14 acts of antisemitism on college campuses in August targeting
Jewish students and institutions.

- At Syracuse University in New York, a staircase was
 vandalized with a swastika.
- Members of Columbia
 University Apartheid Divest
 harassed a Jewish student on campus and waved a Hezbollah flag.

 Miyares announced the release of a
 new educational module aimed at
 combating antisemitism.
- Massachusetts: The Special Commission for Combating Antisemitism released new educational guidance for K-12 institutions to address antisemitism.
- New York: Governor Hochul signed
 Title VI legislation to counter
 campus antisemitism.

Municipal Actions

- In August 2025, the City of Highland Park, Illinois, and the village of Croton-on-Hudson, New York, adopted the IHRA Working Definition of Antisemitism. In total, 104 U.S. municipalities have adopted the IHRA definition, a critical tool in identifying and addressing contemporary antisemitism.
- On August 21, CAM hosted a specialized virtual training session for law enforcement and public safety officials in the city of Elyria, located near Cleveland in northeastern Ohio, to identify and prevent antisemitism.



Government Actions

Governments around the world took meaningful steps in August to counter rising antisemitism. A U.S. judge recognized the Israeli flag as an expression of Jewish identity in a civil rights context, and the U.S. House of Representatives Committee on Education and the Workforce opened an investigation into antisemitism within the National Teachers' Union. Internationally, a German court allowed a Nazi concentration camp memorial to bar keffiyehs, and Australia expelled Iran's ambassador over Tehran regime-orchestrated attacks targeting the Australian Jewish community. Moldovan Prime Minister Dorin Recean assured the Jewish community that his government would work to protect them and combat antisemitism, and the Indonesian government removed antisemitic material in school textbooks.


