

Main Take-Away:

Antisemitism surged in the aftermath of the October 7, 2023, Hamas terrorist attack against Israel. Ever since, incident totals have remained elevated, reflecting what appears to be a new reality of ever-present antisemitism plaguing diaspora Jewish communities.

In the two years before October 7, 2023 - 2021 and 2022 - CAM monitored 2,215 and 1,921 incidents of antisemitism, respectively. In 2023, before October 1, 2023, CAM recorded 1,261 incidents, which would equate to 1,681 incidents if annualized. Yet, in the wake of the October 7 attacks, CAM documented 1,785 incidents of antisemitism - more than the first three-quarters of 2023, and nearly as many as were recorded in all of the previous year, 2022.

The October 1 - December 31, 2023 incident total annualized would equal 7,140 incidents. In 2024, the first full year after October 7, the ARC recorded 6,326 incidents, more than twice the incidents recorded in 2023. Year-to-date 2025, the ARC has recorded 5,100 incidents, which, if annualized, would equate to a total of 6,800 incidents by year's end.

The ARC by CAM methodically tracks antisemitic incidents reported by credible media outlets and verified social media posts, employing advanced cyber-monitoring tools across multiple languages. The ARC also records incidents submitted to the CAM website and "Report It" app and confirmed by ARC researchers as authentic.
