





Campus Antisemitic Incidents **Surge 178.9%** as Academic Year Resumes



#### Incidents Recorded by the ARC Per Year




382 of the 542 incidents (70.5%) recorded in September 2025 involved Israel-related antisemitism, reflecting the persistent trend of anti-Zionist rhetoric and attacks directed at Jewish individuals and institutions in the ongoing aftermath of the October 7th massacre.

- At a protest in Turin, Italy, a man was <u>recorded</u> saying Jewish and Israeli students "should simply be exterminated."
- In Cape Town, South Africa, a
   Jewish comedian was <u>targeted</u> by a
   local newspaper for being a
   "Zionist."
- In Bondi Beach, Australia, a woman said, "A good Zionist is a dead one."

In September 2025, the Antisemitism Research Center (ARC) by CAM monitored **542 antisemitic incidents** across the globe, an average of 18.1 incidents per day. Compared with September 2024, **11.9% fewer** incidents (615 in September 2024 vs. 542 in September 2025) were monitored.

From January 1 to September 30, 2025, a total of 5,116 incidents were recorded, 7.4% higher than the 4,765 incidents tallied from January 1 to September 30, 2024.


#### SEPTEMBER 2025 ANTISEMITIC INCIDENTS




There were 71 acts of vandalism in September (13.1%) targeting Jewish institutions and private properties with swastikas and other antisemitic symbols or threats.

- In Halifax, Canada, three Jewish properties were <u>spray-painted</u> with antisemitic graffiti reading "Jews did 9/11."
- In Ponte Buggianese, Italy,
   billboards were <u>vandalized</u> with
   the message "Jews are worse than
   Hitler."

#### SEPTEMER 2025 ANTISEMITIC INCIDENTS








39 incidents in September (7.2%) involved violence or threats of violence, including physical assaults, bomb threats, and other explicit attempts to intimidate or harm lewish individuals or communities.

- In London, England, a Jewish child and mother were <u>attacked</u> by an assailant screaming "f\*cking Jews!"
- In Berlin, Germany, two Jews were <u>assaulted</u> on the subway.

### Campus Antisemitism in September 2025

- In Italy, pro-Palestinian students <u>beat</u> a professor at the University of Pisa who opposed their BDS initiative and was labeled a "Zionist."
- In the United States, two Syracuse University students <u>threw</u> a bag of pork into a Jewish fraternity on Rosh Hashanah.
- In the United States, two Jewish students at Dartmouth University discovered swastikas <u>drawn</u> on their dorm doors.

#### **Antisemitism in the United States**


151 antisemitic incidents were recorded in the United States in September, representing a 6.8% decrease from the 162 incidents tallied in August 2025.

Across the globe, September saw a drastic increase in campus incidents compared with August. Incidents increased 178.9% from 19 incidents in August 2025 to 53 incidents in September 2025. This surge reflects the resumption of the academic year and the persistent problem of antisemitism at colleges and universities.



- In the United Kingdom, students at the University of Leeds <u>celebrated</u> a Jerusalem terrorist attack.
- In France, students at Sorbonne
  University in Paris <u>discussed</u> a
  targeted shooting attack against
  Jewish students at the school.
- In Argentina, students at the
   Universidad Nacional de Córdoba
   seized control of parts of the campus,
   <u>protesting</u> Israel's "genocide" of the
   Palestinians.

INCIDENTS

In the United States, there were 38 acts of antisemitism on college campuses in September targeting Jewish students and institutions.

This was 171.4% higher than the 14 incidents recorded in August.

- Death threats targeting Jewish students at Cornell University were **emailed** to the student newspaper, *The Cornell Sun Daily*.
- A UNC-Chapel Hill building was <u>vandalized</u> with anti-Israel graffiti and fake blood.



#### U.S. Municipal and State Tracker

- In September, CAM's Law Enforcement Training Program <u>continued</u> its collaboration with the NYPD, offering a specialized session to help teach officers how to identify antisemitic and extremist threats more effectively.
- Wisconsin lawmakers <u>advanced</u>
   discussions on formally adopting the
   International Holocaust Remembrance
   Alliance (IHRA) Working Definition of
   Antisemitism. This would mark a
   significant step toward strengthening
   statewide policy responses to antisemitic
   incidents and hate crimes.

#### Latin America Actions

CAM's outreach across Latin America saw major momentum in September.

- At the National Hispanic Pastors Alliance
  Forum in Washington, D.C., Director of
  Hispanic Affairs Shay Salamon <u>presented</u>
  CAM's Latin America activities and offered
  insights on the latest antisemitism trends
  and data from across the region.
- In Miami, Florida, Salamon was **honored** as a "Missionary of Peace" for his leadership in promoting understanding and unity between faith communities in Latin America.



#### **Government Actions**

Governments around the world took meaningful steps in September to counter rising antisemitism. In Canada, 32 Liberal MPs called for stronger national action against antisemitism. In Colombia, eight mayors made history by adopting the IHRA Working Definition of Antisemitism. In the United States, a House of Representatives committee launched a probe into a far-left anti-Israel group for alleged ties to China, and the National Endowment for the Humanities announced its largest-ever grant to support the Tikvah Foundation's efforts to fight Jew-hatred. Germany unveiled a new national initiative to confront antisemitism, while in Australia, the city of Bayside became the latest municipality to adopt the IHRA definition, following the CAM-hosted Australian Mayors Summit Against Antisemitism.


