




ANTISEMITISM MONTHLY REPORT October 2025

Surge in UK Antisemitism Marks a 45.9 Percent Jump from Last Year

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
In October 2025, the Antisemitism Research Center (ARC) by CAM monitored 669 antisemitic incidents across the globe, an average of 21.6 incidents per day. Compared with October 2024. 0.7% fewer incidents were monitored (674 in October 2024 vs. 669 in October 2025).

From January 1 to October 31, 2025, a total of 5.785 incidents were recorded. 6.4% higher than the 5,439 incidents tallied from January 1 to October 31, 2024.

553 of the 669 incidents (82.7%) recorded in October 2025 involved Israel-related antisemitism, reflecting the persistent trend of anti-Zionist rhetoric and attacks directed at Jewish individuals and institutions in the ongoing aftermath of the October 7th massacre.


- The South African Medical Association cut ties with its Israeli counterpart and called for its expulsion from the World Medical Association.
- A New York City restaurant was vandalized with graffiti reading "Zionist eatery."
- A mural of the Bibas family in Milan, Italy, was defaced during a synagogue memorial ceremony.

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Categorized by Rhetorical Manifestation ("CHAI" System)




There were 71 acts of vandalism in October (10.6%) targeting Jewish institutions and private properties with swastikas or other antisemitic symbols or threats.

- In Italy, a Rome kosher shop was <u>spray-painted</u> with a hateful message reading "Jews of sh*t... burn them all."
- In Barcelona, Spain, Jewish homes were <u>targeted</u> with graffiti reading "Love the neighborhood, hate Zionism."

OCTOBER 2025 ANTISEMITIC INCIDENTS








35 incidents in October (5.2%) involved violence or threats of violence, including physical assaults, bomb threats, and other explicit attempts to intimidate or harm Jewish individuals or communities.

- A rabbi in Bergenfield, New Jersey, was <u>violently assaulted</u>.
- In Vienna, Austria, a 12-year-old boy was <u>attacked</u> by classmates on his way home from school.
- An Israeli tourist visiting New York
 City was <u>beaten</u> outside of a kosher
 restaurant.



Incidents of Antisemitism in United Kingdom

- On Yom Kippur, an Islamist terrorist <u>attacked</u> a Manchester Orthodox synagogue, killing two congregants.
- At University College London (UCL), students disrupted an Israeli professor's classroom and <u>threatened</u> to "behead" him.
- Maccabi Tel Aviv fans were <u>barred</u> from attending an away game in Birmingham, England.
- Brighton Jews attending synagogue services were <u>harassed</u> by a perpetrator shouting "child killers."

Antisemitism in United States

266 antisemitic incidents were recorded in the United States in October, representing a 12.2% decrease from the 303 incidents recorded in October 2024.

Antisemitism in United Kingdom

143 antisemitic incidents were recorded in the United Kingdom in October, representing a 45.9% increase from the 98 incidents recorded in October 2024 and a 38.8% increase from the 103 incidents recorded in September 2025.




Across the globe, there were 177 acts of antisemitism on college campuses in October targeting Jewish students and institutions.

- McGill University Professor Chantal
 David <u>posted</u> online that she supported
 "kill[ing]" all of her "hardcore Zionist
 colleagues."
- Austin Community College Professor Roy Casagranda <u>falsely claimed</u> the U.S. wanted the Holocaust to be "as bad as possible" to justify the creation of the State of Israel.



U.S. CAMPUS ANTISEMITIC INCIDENTS JANUARY-OCTOBER 2025



In the United States, there were 144 acts of antisemitism on college campuses in October targeting Jewish students and institutions.

- Students at the University of Maryland <u>passed</u> an anti-Israel, antisemitic BDS resolution on Yom Kippur.
- A student at the University of Washington <u>disrupted</u> a class with Nazi salutes and chants of "Heil Hitler."
- A sukkah at Texas A&M University was <u>vandalized</u> with "Free Palestine" graffiti.



U.S. Municipal and State Tracker

CAM continued to help drive meaningful action against antisemitism across the U.S.

- In Wisconsin, a legislative committee held a **hearing** on a bill to adopt the IHRA Working Definition of Antisemitism into state law.
- In partnership with CAM, the city of Clearfield, Utah unanimously <u>adopted</u> the IHRA Working Definition of Antisemitism.
- In Oregon, the Corvallis City Council voted 6-3 to <u>reject</u> a proposed anti-Israel BDS resolution, after receiving a letter from CAM Chief Government Affairs Officer Lisa Katz opposing the measure.

Latin America Actions

CAM's outreach across Latin America gained significant momentum in October.

- In Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, regional leaders and government officials <u>came together</u> for the "Hate Has No Place in Latin America" forum, co-organized by CAM, to strengthen regional cooperation in the fight against antisemitism.
- To commemorate the second anniversary of the October 7th Hamas attack, the State of Rio de Janeiro paid <u>tribute</u> to the victims and honored CAM's leadership in the global effort to combat antisemitism.



Government Actions

In the United States, federal officials opened a wide-ranging civil rights probe into antisemitism, while a bipartisan congressional resolution was introduced condemning Hamas's violence against Palestinian civilians in Gaza. The British government advanced a new comprehensive plan to address rising antisemitism nationwide and announced targeted reforms within the National Health Service. The U.S. Department of Education reached an agreement with the University of Virginia establishing new accountability measures and education initiatives to combat antisemitism on campus and ensure a safer environment for Jewish students. In Germany, the government pledged a historic \$1 billion for Holocaust survivor home care, strengthening long-term support for victims of the Nazis.
