

Incidents Recorded by the ARC Per Year



364 of the 548 incidents (66.4%) recorded in November 2025 involved Israel-related antisemitism, reflecting the persistent trend of anti-Zionist rhetoric and attacks directed at Jewish individuals and institutions in the ongoing aftermath of the October 7th massacre.


- A business owner in Melbourne, Australia, refused to hire an Israeli woman because of her nationality, saying, “I hope you leave Melbourne soon” and “Free Palestine.”
- Demonstrators chanted “Globalize the Intifada” and other violent antisemitic threats outside a New York City Synagogue.

In November 2025, the Antisemitism Research Center (ARC) by CAM monitored **548 antisemitic incidents across the globe**, an average of 18.3 incidents per day. Compared with November 2024, **21.2% more incidents** were monitored (452 in November 2024 vs. 548 in November 2025).

From January 1 to November 30, 2025, a total of 6,333 incidents were recorded, 7.5% higher than the 5,891 incidents tallied from January 1 to November 30, 2024, and **surpassing the 6,326 incidents the ARC recorded in all of 2024**.


NOVEMBER 2025 ANTISEMITIC INCIDENTS

Categorized by Rhetorical Manifestation (“CHAI” System)




There were 91 acts of vandalism in November (16.6%) targeting Jewish institutions and private properties with swastikas or other antisemitic symbols or threats.

- Vandals defaced a Milan mural honoring Shiri Bibas and her sons, Kfir and Ariel, all kidnapped and murdered by Hamas, for the second time in two weeks.
- Kehilat Shaarei Torah Synagogue in Toronto, Canada was vandalized for the tenth time since the October 7th massacre.



NOVEMBER 2025 ANTISEMITIC INCIDENTS


Categorized by Manifestation



34 incidents in November (6.2%) involved violence or threats of violence, including physical assaults, bomb threats, and other explicit attempts to intimidate or harm Jewish individuals or communities.


- Police in Cannes, France, arrested a man who threatened to blow up a synagogue.
- “Save a child, kill a rabbi” vandalism was scrawled on an overpass in Toronto, Canada.
- Israel foiled a large Hamas terror network in Bethlehem, seizing weapons the terrorists planned to use in attacks against Jewish Israeli civilians.
- “Kill the Jews and let’s liberate Gaza” was spray-painted on a wall in the city of Anzio, Italy.

Antisemitism in Germany

79 antisemitic incidents were recorded in Germany in November, a 172.4% increase from the 29 incidents recorded the previous month.

This uptick was largely driven by a crazed man in Hanau who painted 50 swastikas across the city with his blood.

Also in Germany:

- Anti-Israel activists vandalized the *Bundeskanzleramt*, the German Chancellery, with red paint, evoking the blood libel.
- A yeshiva student was harassed on a Berlin tram by a assailant who shouted, “Free Palestine, you son of a b*tch!”

Antisemitism in the United States


174 antisemitic incidents were recorded in the United States in November, representing a 6.1% increase from the 164 incidents recorded in November 2024.

- A swastika was drawn on a lamppost in Cape Coral, Florida.
- Podcaster Tucker Carlson equated Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu with the Nazis.
- A Florida neo-Nazi was arrested by the FBI, who accused the man of planning a mass casualty event.




Across the globe, there were 80 acts of antisemitism on college campuses in November targeting Jewish students and institutions.

- Vandals at Concordia University in Montreal wrote “Kill all Jews” and “Allahu Akbar” on a campus bathroom wall.
- Former Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Olmert’s lecture at the Oxford Union was disrupted by protesters.
- A lecturer at University College London (UCL), addressing the campus Students for Justice in Palestine (SJP) chapter, spread the false, antisemitic “blood libel” narrative, telling the students to “investigate, draw your own narrative.”




U.S. CAMPUS ANTISEMITIC INCIDENTS JANUARY–NOVEMBER 2025



U.S. CAMPUS ANTISEMITIC INCIDENTS

Year-to-Year Comparison



In the United States, there were 56 acts of antisemitism on college campuses in November targeting Jewish students and institutions.

- An imam at a City College of New York (CCNY) interfaith event led a walk-out to protest the presence of “Zionists.”
- “Death, Death to the IDF” and “Globalize the Intifada” were discovered written on a chalkboard at the University of Colorado-Boulder.
- Antisemitic protesters chanted “Death to the IDF” outside of the Chabad center at Tulane University in New Orleans, Louisiana.

U.S. State and Municipal Tracker

Across the United States, there was meaningful action taken against antisemitism in November:

- CAM issued a forceful statement following the mayoral victory of Zohran Mamdani, warning that his record and rhetoric have raised legitimate concerns among Jewish New Yorkers.
- In Wisconsin, CAM briefed lawmakers on the escalating threat landscape, underscoring the necessity of robust state-level measures to counter rising antisemitism.
- In Texas, Governor Greg Abbott signed an Executive Order designating CAIR and the Muslim Brotherhood as foreign terror groups.
- In Arizona, state legislators prefiled a resolution calling on the federal government to label CAIR a foreign terrorist group.

Latin America Actions

CAM's outreach across Latin America advanced in November with a major regional milestone: the Latin American Network of Former Fellows and Friends of Israel (RLEBAI), spanning 18 countries, formally adopted the IHRA Working Definition of Antisemitism at a ceremony in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

In a significant diplomatic development, Argentina has formally launched the Isaac Accords, a new cooperative framework aimed at strengthening political, economic, and cultural ties between Israel and Latin American states. The initiative aims to foster deeper collaboration across innovation, security, trade, and cultural exchange.



Government Actions

In November 2025, governments across the world advanced a series of significant initiatives aimed at countering antisemitism, extremist threats, and the spread of radical ideologies. Germany moved decisively to ban an Islamist organization accused of inciting hostility toward Israel, while Poland adopted its first-ever national plan to confront antisemitism. Sweden strengthened its institutional framework with the appointment of a National Coordinator on Jew-Hatred. The Trump administration initiated a process to explore additional sanctions on the Muslim Brotherhood. Australia added Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) to its list of state sponsors of terrorism, marking a major shift in its national security posture.


