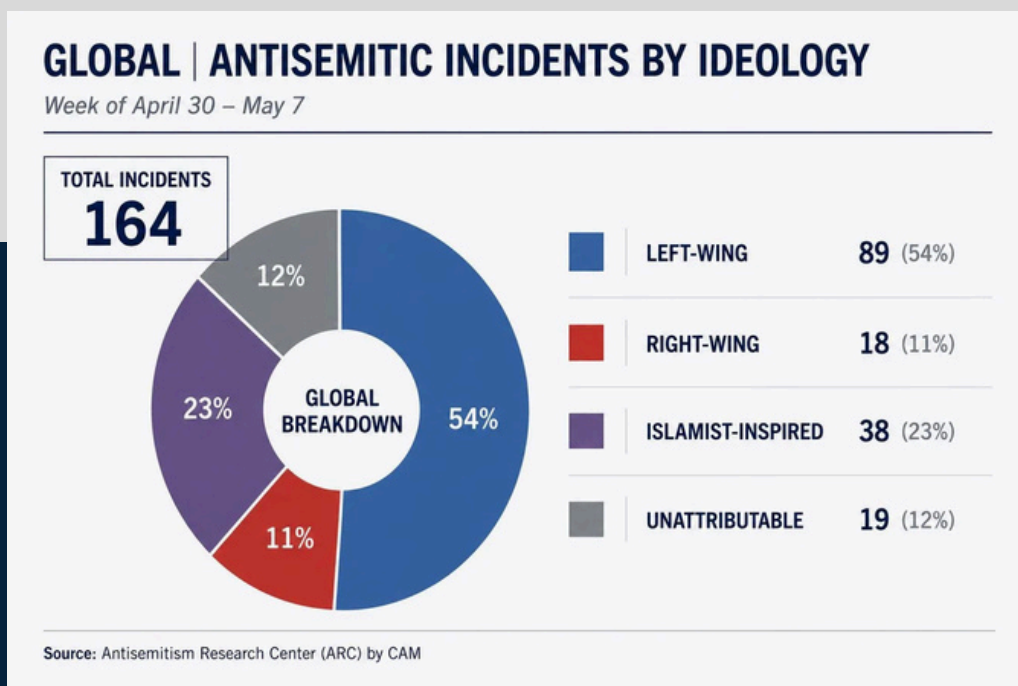

Antisemitic Incidents Report

April 30–May 7 2026

- Since January 1, CAM has monitored reports of **2,543 incidents of antisemitism worldwide**. An average of **141 incidents has been monitored weekly in 2026**.
- Over the past week, a total of **163 antisemitic incidents** were recorded globally, averaging more than **26 incidents per day and more than one incident every hour**. A full list of incidents is [available here](#), with a subset listed on page 3.
- CAM identified a campaign of more than **170 AI-generated “Rabbis”** in multiple languages, including English, Japanese, Spanish, German, French and Italian, **spreading antisemitic tropes to millions** of users on Instagram, Facebook, and TikTok.
- **Facts of the Week:**
 - Jews were targeted in 60% of all hate crimes in New York City in the first four months of 2026, according to new NYPD data.

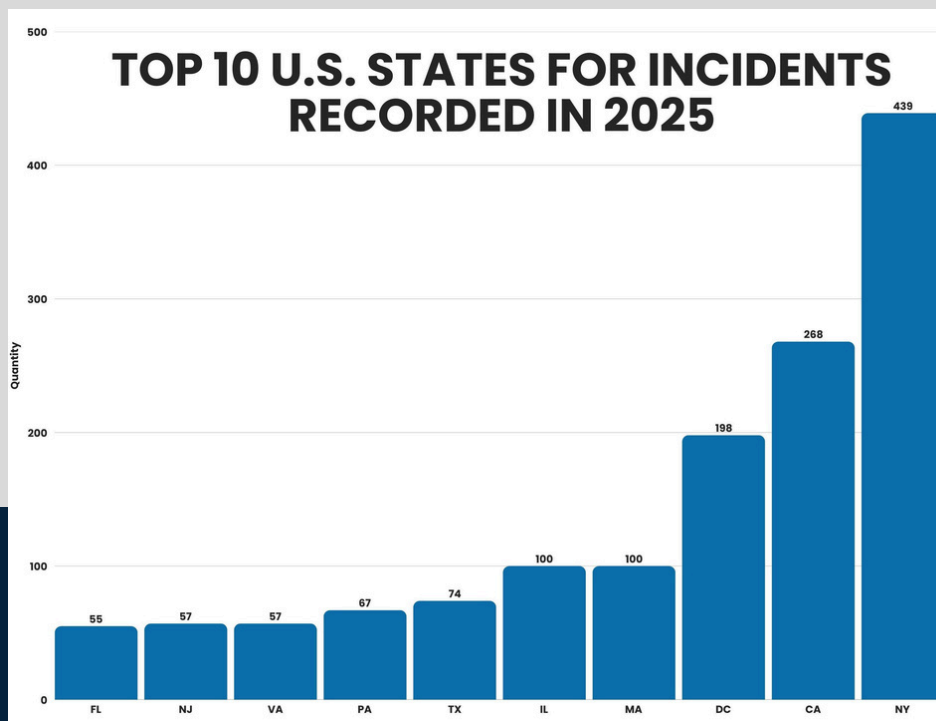


Key Facts on Antisemitism

- In 2025, a record-breaking wave of antisemitism was documented worldwide, with **6,819 incidents reported, an average of 131 per week, marking a 7.8% increase from 2024**.
- The number of people murdered in acts of antisemitic violence around the world in 2025 was **40**.

Key Facts on Antisemitism

- The ARC documented **1,955 antisemitic incidents in the United States in 2025** compared with 2,553 incidents in 2024. The highest number of incidents occurred in New York (439) and California (268), followed by Washington, D.C. (198), and Massachusetts and Illinois (100 each).
- CAM's survey found that at least **3.5 million American Jews**, representing 61% of the U.S. Jewish community, have experienced antisemitism since October 7, 2023, the day of Hamas' massive attack on Israel.



The Antisemitism Research Center (ARC) operates a rigorous, intelligence driven monitoring system aligned with the highest professional standards. Covering English, Spanish, French, and German, with expansion underway, ARC collects data from established media, verified social media accounts, direct reporting, and other vetted global sources.

All incidents undergo strict verification and classification processes comparable to those used by leading law enforcement agencies. Each case is documented with supporting evidence and cross checked to ensure accuracy and consistency. General rhetorical expressions on social media are excluded to maintain a precise and reliable dataset.

The ARC recently updated its categorization parameters. Incidents involving far-left perpetrators influenced by Islamist ideology will now be categorized as Islamist-Inspired, rather than Far-Left as they were previously.

Actions Update

April 30-May 7, 2026

- The ARC released a report exposing a coordinated network of fake AI-generated “rabbis” spreading antisemitic tropes across TikTok. ARC researchers uncovered 49 TikTok accounts featuring such “rabbis” with more than 950,000 followers. **Read More.**
- President Donald Trump issued a Jewish American Heritage Month proclamation and called for a “national Sabbath” to be observed on May 15-16. **Read More.**
- More than 200 mayors have endorsed a CAM-organized letter urging city leaders nationwide to celebrate Jewish American Heritage Month. **Read More.**
- The East Palo Alto City Council passed a resolution adopting the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA) Working Definition of Antisemitism. **Read More.**
- CAM joined a coalition of 26 organizations calling on Congress to pass the DETERRENT Act, a legislative measure aimed at bolstering transparency of foreign funding of U.S. higher education institutions. **Read More.**
- After an outcry from the Australian Jewish community and a CAM advocacy campaign, Sydney Lord Mayor Clover Moore’s banned a “Globalize the Intifada” forum from being held at the East Sydney Community and Arts Center. **Read More.**
- CAM Public Affairs Advocate for Australia Sheina Gutnick, daughter of the late Reuven Morrison who was killed in the Bondi Beach Hanukkah massacre, testified at the first public hearing of Australia’s Royal Commission on Antisemitism and Social Cohesion. **Read More.**
- CAM Executive Director of Latin American Affairs Shay Salamon visited Honduras this week, where he met with First Vice President María Antonieta Mejía and Minister of the Secretariat of State for Risk Management and National Contingencies (COPECO) Reinaldo Sanchez. **Read More.**



Antisemitic Incidents

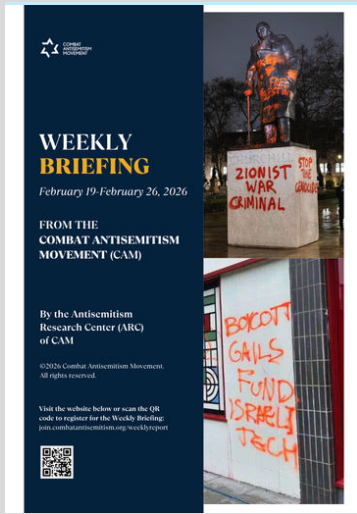
April 30, 2026–May 7, 2026

- **New York City:** At a protest outside Park East Synagogue, demonstrators chanted, “We don’t want no two states, we want all of it,” “Death to the IDF,” “There is only one solution, intifada revolution,” and “End the settler Zionist state.” **Read More.**
- **New York City:** Vandals defaced synagogues, homes, and car with Nazi swastika graffiti in Queens. **Read More.**
- **Ann Arbor, Michigan:** At a University of Michigan graduation ceremony, Faculty Senate Chair Derek Peterson praised pro-Palestinian students who “opened our hearts to the injustice and inhumanity of Israel’s war in Gaza.” **Read More.**
- **Toronto, Canada:** A shooter in a passing vehicle fired a gel pellet gun at visibly Jewish passersby, who suffered minor injuries. **Read More.**

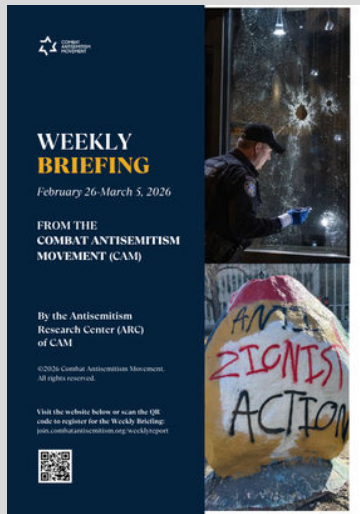


- **Newcastle, England:** A Green Party City Council candidate, Tina Ion, posted that “every single Zionist” should be killed from a Threads account using the handle “thereal.anne.frank.” **Read More.**
- **Besançon, France:** An poster blaming Israel for rising fuel prices and featuring a shocking antisemitic caricature was spotted at a gas station. **Read More.**
- **Sydney, Australia:** A man wore a shirt reading “Antisemitism: Proud to Be Accused” outside a hearing of the Royal Commission on Antisemitism and Social Cohesion. **Read More.**
- **Seoul, South Korea:** A demonstrator wore a Hamas headband at a “Solidarity With Palestine” rally. **Read More.**
